

By opening its doors to the public, the **DIOCESAN MUSEUM OF SANTARÉM** offers the visitors the possibility to intimately discover a monumental, multi-centennial and extraordinary architecture. Of Jesuit pattern but with reminiscences transporting one's imaginary to the ancient *vila régia* (royal village) in medieval and modern times, the Cathedral complex constitutes a major reference in the urban picture of Santarém. The Diocesan Museum of Santarém also offers the visitors the privilege to view dozens of rare or even totally unknown pieces of religious art, which the twists and turns of history have made patrimony of faith of the people of the Ribatejo. The architecture and the pieces

of religious art tell, in different ways and with different means, numerous little stories within a big history! The fascinating story of *Uma mulher bela* (A beautiful woman), whose life takes place in a unique moment of the great human adventure is, still today, profoundly inspiring to millions of people around the world.


